

## Rabbitfish—Foxface

### *Siganus vulpinus*



#### Natural Range

Throughout the western Indo-Pacific.

#### Maximum Size and Longevity

In nature, up to 30 cm

#### Water Quality

Temperature: 24°C - 26°C.

pH: 8.0—8.4

SG: 1.020—1.024

#### Feeding

Omnivorous feeding on marine algae such as *Caulerpa*, dried seaweed (Nori sheets) and frozen and live foods such as mysis shrimp. Part of its attraction for hobbyists is its love of algae – this beautiful marine will also help keep your tank clean! Have also been observed feeding on soft and hard corals.

#### Compatibility

Can be housed with more aggressive fish, as its venomous spines afford it natural protection, but avoid other rabbitfish as tank mates.

#### General Information

A beautiful Marine fish, the Foxface is instantly recognizable due to its distinctive colouration and elongated snout. Bright yellow with a black and white banded face, it is a hardy marine that fares well in aquaria. It will change colour to a dark brown at night or when stressed, so allow time for it to settle into its new home on arrival before you will see it fully coloured.

#### Caution!
